



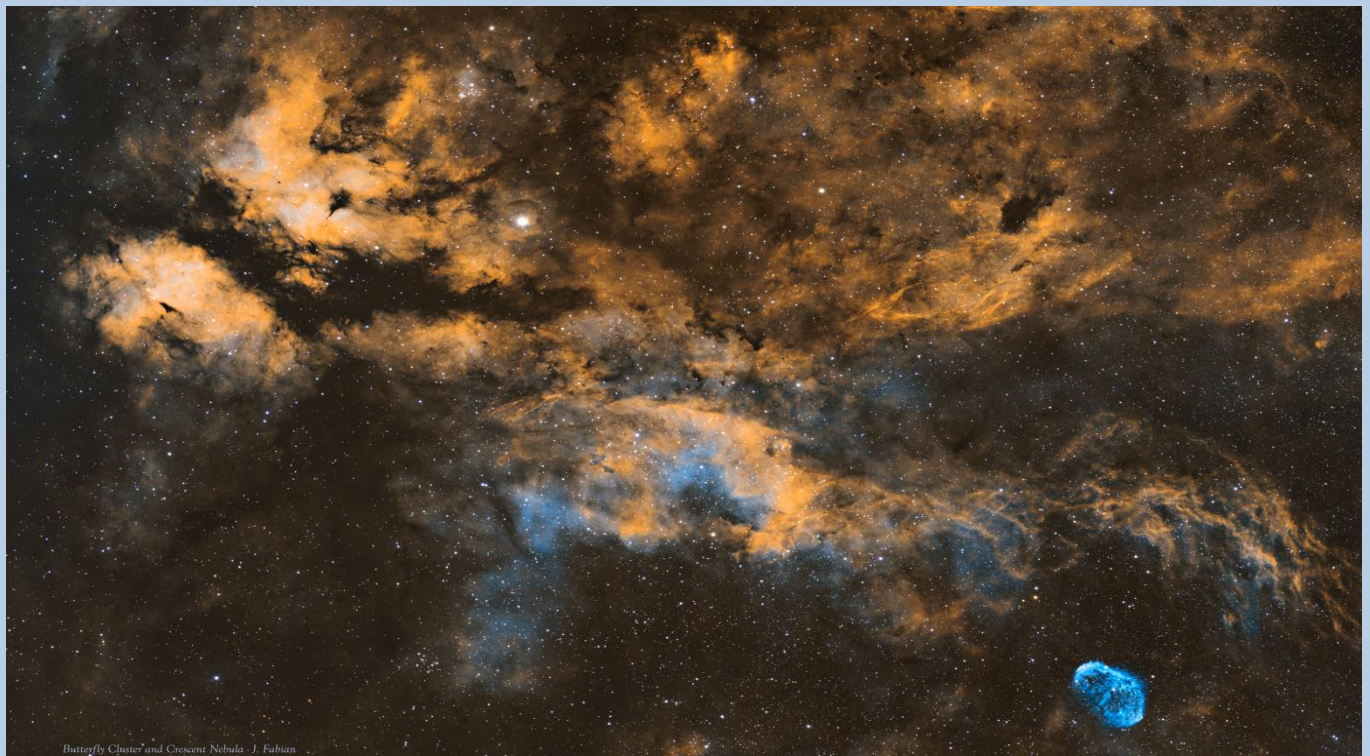

In her book "The Future is History" (2017), journalist Masha Gessen tracks in a personal and touching way what she sees as "a toxic legacy" of the Soviet Union era, through the notion of a people captivated by their traumatic past. Russia's traumatic history, she argues, underlies much of its present politics and condemns its people to repeat its history of dictatorship and submission. Russia's future, Gessen suggests, stands outside history, hence outside time. Since World War II, the phenomenon of trauma has become central to our understanding of the cultural, political, and psychological challenges that define what it means to live in the postmodern era. The other part of Gessen's book tells the story of survival. It is a story of heroic academics who create fields of thought that have been destroyed by the Soviets, and re-built psychoanalysis from the ground up. Bohleber reminds us that psychoanalysis began as a theory of trauma by linking the roots of hysteria to memory, and more precisely, to the failure to remember which leads to repetition and to the conflation of self and other, past and present, here and there. Perhaps because trauma is at the origin of the psychoanalytic project, it should not surprise us that the question of historical origin has haunted the psychoanalytic understanding of trauma since its very beginning.

History is a very difficult concept for psychoanalysts, because it is a reconstruction that includes "what has not happened, what happens to others and not to me, what never happened at all, and what I could never dream of happening." This year's National Congress for the Canadian Psychoanalytic Society will center on the question of trauma from the dilemma of temporality through the notion of psychic returns: transference, inheritance, breakdown, destruction, and survival. The problem of history can be framed through a set of clinical dilemmas: How do we recover from the destruction of what has already occurred? How do we approach new learnings while facing the "catastrophe" (Bion) of change? Given the phantasmic, belatedness or Nachträglichkeit nature of psychic temporality, can trauma be traced to an original cause? What is the role of fantasy in experiencing an event as traumatic? How does psychoanalytic conceptualization of history orient our therapeutic technique?
